- Aims of IQF Working Group
 - To establish a support structure to improve performance
- IQF presented to General Assembly 2020 and accepted
- IQF Working Group to develop Schemes of Work for Training.

- Article 4 General principles
- Article 5 Coordinator for safety and health matters during the project preparation stage
- Article 6 Coordinator for safety and health matters during the project execution stage.

- Use EQF principles for Standards
- Capability depends on:
 - Knowledge;
 - Skills; and
 - Autonomy/responsibility
- Standards at EQF levels 5, 6 and 7
- For each element of each Article we have defined what we believe are the relevant knowledge, skills and autonomy/ responsibility at each of the 3 levels.

- Performance Standard (Qualification Framework) can be used for many things
 - Benchmarking.
 - Accreditation.
 - Training.
 - International Recognition.

- A personal quality assessment scheme based upon the performance standard
- Some countries have accreditation by
 - the State
 - professional bodies
- Most countries do not have any formal or informal accreditation
- ISHCCO decided not to proceed with accreditation scheme at this stage.
