

READING NOTES FOR THE DOCUMENT "FEP PARTNER INSTITUTION LIST"

- 1) Partner schools are listed by country, in alphabetical order, and split between Europe–Erasmus (mobility programmes eligible for E+ financing) and other countries (programmes typically not eligible for financing).
- 2) 2nd column: name of partner school. Contains a link to the school's international website with relevant information for mobility students, including any language requirements; some schools require specific informal or official certificates (e.g., TOEFL) that, while not mandatory for the pre-application phase at FEP, must be obtained before the application is formally submitted to the partner university.
- **3) 3**rd **to 5**th **columns: places available per cycle of study.** For the 1st cycle (1°C), places are split between Economics and Management—some schools offer places for both programmes, others just for one; the places available are always for one semester of study.
- 4) 6th column: professor in charge. The name of the professor in charge applies only to the first cycle of study (1°C), since at the master's level the mobility coordinators are the respective master's programme directors/committee; the offer available for the 2nd cycle is, generally, open to all master's programmes and, in some cases, a specific school is recommended for one or more of the latter.
- **5) 7**th **column: suggested curriculum.** The suggested curriculum applies only to the 1st cycle and must be consulted to determine the viability of a mobility period to a given school; the curriculum may be adjustable according to the specificities of the student's course of study and with updated information regarding the partner university's course offer in English in INFO (8th column).
- 6) 8th column: INFO. The INFO section contains links to the academic offer of the partner school (course offer) and the partner school's fact sheet (useful information); students must consult the information on the courses offered and compare it with the suggested course of study; any changes to the suggested course of study must be approved by the professor in charge.
