### Access conditions and criteria for selection and ranking

#### Specific conditions to access the cycle of studies

The following may apply for this cycle of studies:

- Holders of a Bachelor's degree (Licenciatura) or legal equivalent in Civil Engineering.

- Holders of a foreign higher education degree awarded after a 1st cycle of studies in Civil Engineering structured in accordance with the Bologna Process by a State that implemented this process.

- Holders of a foreign higher education degree in Civil Engineering that is recognized as meeting the objectives of a Bachelor's degree by the statutorily competent scientific body (SCSB).

- Those with an academic, scientific or professional curriculum recognized as attesting to their ability to carry out this cycle of studies by the SCSB.

Applicants must have solid prior education in the following subjects (indicatively expressed by the number of ECTS shown):

- Material behaviour of concrete and steel (6 ECTS)

- Analysis of hyperstatic structures; Stress calculation (15 ECTS)

- Calculation of reinforced concrete members (6 ECTS)

- Soil mechanics (6 ECTS)

<ol> <li>a. Holding a 3-year Bachelor's degree (Licenciatura or legal equivalent) in Civil Engineering or related area: 140 points (out of 200).</li> <li>b. Holding a 5-year degree (Pre-Bologna Licenciado Degree, Integrated Master or equivalent) in Civil Engineering or related area: 200 points (out of 200).</li> </ol>	20%

The total of Criterion 4 cannot exceed 200 points.

#### Obs.:

In the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> phases, only applicants with an application grade equal to, or higher than, 140 (out of 200) will be admitted.

In the 3<sup>rd</sup> phase, only applicants who cumulatively comply with the two following conditions will be admitted: (i) Numerical grade of the degree defined in 1. with a minimum of 95 (out of 200) and (ii) application grade equal to, or higher than, 95 (out of 200).

Applicants tie-breaking criterion (it can be the classification obtained on some of the elements from the previous table)

In the event of a tie, priority will be given to the candidate with the highest score in Criterion 2. If this criterion is not sufficient, the tiebreaker will be based on Criterion 3.
