A – Specific access conditions to the cycle of studies

Specific access conditions to the cycle of studies

Holders of integrated master, bachelor or legal equivalent in Nursing, Clinical Psychology, Medicine or related areas to Health Sciences are admitted to the selection process, *ideally* with proven previous experience in relation with patients in clinical context.

B – Criteria and sub criteria of applicant's selection and seriation

A. Preselection – applicants will be submitted to a preselection process by the scientific commission that will consider the following general criteria:

1. Academic path:

1.1. Degree's final classification (integrated master or legal equivalent) - **up to 10 points: 17-20 values = 10 points; 13-16 values = 5 points; 10-12 values = 0 points**

1.2. Graduation field – up to **20 points: degree in nursing or clinical psychology (or with strong clinical component) = 20 points; degree in another field of clinical action or non-clinical psychology = 10 points; degree in another relevant field of life or health sciences = 5 points**

1.3. Other academic degrees besides the minimum requirements, advanced courses or another additional and relevant academic training – **5 points**

Clinical experience (years of practice) – up to 30 points: <i>more than 3 = 30 points; 2-3 = 20 points; 1-2 = 15 points; 6 months to 1 year = 10 points; less than 6 months = 5 points</i></p> <p>2.2. Other non-clinical professional experience relevant – up to 10 points (<i>laboratory diagnosis services, activities of scientific dissemination, activities in patient’s associations or other activities in the field of health – up to 5 points in each one of these items</i>)</p> <p>2.3. Interview - preselected applicants (in number not higher than 25, according to seriation made by the previous criteria) will be submitted to interview, to clarify (i) their academic path, (ii) professional experience and (iii) motivation, as well as to (iv) assess their skills, knowledge and attitudes, and their learning capacity and professional development, regarding training and objectives that should be achieved with this master. Will be subsequently selected based in the following criteria:</p>	
<p>1. Academic path:</p> <p>1.1. Degree’s final classification (integrated master or legal equivalent) - up to 10 points: <i>17-20 values = 10 points; 13-16 values = 5 points; 10-12 values = 0 points</i></p> <p>1.2. Graduation field – up to 20 points: <i>degree in nursing or clinical psychology (or with clinical connection) = 20 points; degree in another field of clinical action or non-clinical psychology = 10 points; degree in another field of life or health sciences = 5 points</i></p> <p>1.3. Other academic degrees besides the minimum requirements, advanced courses or another additional and relevant academic training – 5 points</p> <p>2. Professional, clinical, technical and/or scientific experience:</p> <p>2.1. Clinical experience (years of practice) – up to 30 points: <i>more than 3 = 30 points; 2-3 = 20 points; 1-2 = 15 points; 6 months to 1 year = 10 points; less than 6 months = 5 points</i></p> <p>2.2.
