Name of the Cycle of Studies

Master's Degree in Forensic Medicine

A – Specific conditions for access to the cycle of studies

According to the general regulations of the 2nd and 3rd cycles of UPorto, this information is the responsibility of the Cycle of Studies' Scientific Committee and is subject to approval by the Faculty Director. Exception made to the **cycles of studies jointly with other Higher Education Institutions (IES)**, to which the principles defined in the respective collaboration agreement apply, as well as in the specific regulation of the cycle of studies, formulated in accordance with the Legal Regime of Higher Education Degrees and Diplomas (DL 65/2018, 16 August). Whenever possible, the scientific areas of the qualifications required for the application should be mentioned.

Specific conditions for access to the cycle of studies

Candidates who meet the conditions set out in article 17 of Decree-Law No. 74/2006, of 24 March, as amended by Decree-Law No.65/2018, de 16 de August, in the areas of Health Sciences, Social and Behavioural Sciences and Law, or related fields, are admitted to the second cycle of studies in Forensic Medicine (MML).

B – Criteria and sub-criteria for selection and ranking of candidates

The selection and ranking criteria should be defined using clear, objective and easily applicable and justifiable variables, to safeguard the transparency and accuracy of the evaluation of the applications.

The assessment of criteria and sub-criteria measured through a numerical scale allows a more objective evaluation of the candidate's potential and academic/scientific/artistic/professional capacity.

NOTE: The application of the tiebreaker criteria will only be applied in the ranking of the non-admitted candidates, so that they can be ordered, considering a possible contact as alternates. Until the vacancies limit, the admitted candidates and with identical scores are ordered alphabetically.
